

Incanto, the new collection presented by CTA®, takes inspiration from the Italian wonders of Unesco heritage, which should be visited at least once in a lifetime. Territories rich in history, breathtaking landscapes, crystal clear waters have given their names to the wide range of fabrics of this collection.

Incanto's fabrics, indeed, completely absorb the spirit of these unique places. The peculiarity of the new collection is the one to propose excellent fabrics both modern and classical, with sophisticated yarns, embroidered designs, engraved decorations and sophisticated materials and quality.

Also in the new 2019 proposal we find the CTA® winning feature, that is to say the offer of products which can be combined, suitable for different uses like curtains, decoration and upholstery.

An offer which is characterized by a wide range of colours to satisfy different needs.



AMALFI

Amalfi is an area of outstanding natural beauty located along the Tyrrhenian coast of Italy and it is characterized by terraces for cultivation of vineyards and monuments of great artistic and architectural value.

Amalfi is a printed curtain with watercolour effect printed flowers in 100% PL. It offers two colours coordination, one in the blue-green tones and the other one in the purple and forest green tones in width 295/300 cm with lead.

CILENTO

Cilento, land of Campania with smooth hills covered by olive groves which are mirrored in the blue Tyrrhenian Sea, has always been a thoroughfare of people and traditions. It is crossed by lively streams, rich in woods and holm oaks, its beautiful landscape is interrupted by villages settled in the rocks or lying on the sea shore. And it is here that the magnificent National Park of **Cilento** rises and in 1998 was included in the Unesco list. The curtains, of the new CTA® collection, inspired by **Cilento**, is an elegant tie-dye Jacquard in Viscose (65%) Cotton (15%) Polyester (10%) and Nylon (10%) in width 310/315 cm. **Cilento** fabric presents an animalier design ideal for curtains and decoration and available in golden yellow, forest green, turtledove, coloured powder, natural and beige.





CINQUETERRE

The **Cinque Terre**, Unesco World Heritage Site since 1997, is named after the 5 small villages which are a part of the sea and of the Ligurian hinterland. Some of these villages like Vernazza and Manarola, have been built on a cliff overlooking the sea that leaves you breathless.

Cinque Terre is a printed curtain with a tridimensional effect in 100% PL. It is available in width 295/300 cm with lead in 3 colours coordination: the first one in the blu-green and forest green tones and the second one in the golden yellow, purple and forest green tones and the last one in the black, grey and turtledove tones.

DUOMO

Milan Cathedral is the largest and complex Gothic building of Italy, made of white and pink marble from Candoglia Cave in Val D'Ossola.

Duomo is a fabric characterized by a damask design, the burnout technique of which recalls the empty and full brickwork of the Cathedral. It is composed of 64% VI 36% PL and available in three colours: dove grey, grey and white in width 315/320 cm with lead.







GARDA BOY - GARDA GIRL

The collection **Garda boy** and **Garda girl** is inspire to Gardaland, a fun park for kids located near the wonderful Lake Garda, the largest Italian Lake. Fabrics inspired by the world of children, suitable for furnishing their bedrooms both as curtains and decoration, with a wide proposal of printed designs. The curtains are in 100% PL in width 295/300 cm with lead, while the decoration fabrics are in 50% CO 50% PL in width 280 cm. **Garda boy** and **Garda girl** are available in light blue, grey, pink and fuchsia.







LAGUNA

Since 1987, Venice and its lagoon, have been listed in the Unesco World Heritage Site for the uniqueness and singularity of their cultural values that consist of an historical, archaeological, urban, architectural, artistic heritage and of exceptional cultural traditions, integrated in a natural and landscaping extraordinary environment.

Laguna is a jacquard fabric with designs dating back to the Renaissance period of the Venetian Republic: one large damask design and a small one in coordination. **Laguna** is a mix 68% PL 32% LI in width 300 cm. The designs are available in 7 colours: natural, beige, dove grey, brick, gold, cocoa and blue. The product can also be developed in FR version.

MONFERRATO

In 2004 the **Monferrato** wine landscape was listed as Unesco World Heritge Site. Wonderful places strongly characterized by hills, castles, small villages and vineyards able to produce wines among the best in the world.

Monferrato is a leno weave proposal with a shading effect. It is suitable for curtains in 93% PL 7% LI in width 320/325 cm with lead. Monferrato is available in five colours: natural, grey, acid green, orange and blue.







MONREALE

Monreale is a lovely municipality of Palermo metropolitan area and it was declared World Heritage Site by Unesco in 2015 thanks to the wonderful cathedral and to its rich Byzantine mosaics that decorate its inside.

Monreale is born from this spectacular landscape in 35% LI 35% CO 30% CU, suitable for curtains and decorations in width 310/315 cm. **Monreale** is a tie-dye Jacquard, available in 8 nuances from natural colours (natural, white, turtledove, grey, coloured powder, lino colour) to more intense tones like golden yellow and forest green.

NOTO

Noto called "capital of Baroque". In 2002 its historic city was declared Unesco World Heritage Site together with Val di Noto. This fabric is named after this scenery,

Noto is a jacquard with two classical designs, one large ornamental damask and a small one in coordination. **Noto** is a mix of 68% PL 32% LI in 300 cm and available in 7 colours: natural, beige, dove grey, brick, gold, cocoa and blue. The product can also be developed in FR version.







PAESTUM

It is an ancient city of Magna Grecia located in Campania Region in the Plain of Sele near Salerno. It is a wonderful archaeological site surrounded by the National Park of Cilento, **Paestum** is one of many treasures which make Italy an extraordinary open-air museum.

Paestum fabric is named after this city; it is in 55% PL 45% LI a filet embroidery with different points which create a play of light. It is available in 2 colours: natural and ecrù in width 325/330 cm.

PALIO

The Palio is the most important event organized in the city of Siena and it takes place every year on 2nd July and 16th August. During the Palio, the "Contrade" of Siena, i.e the districts, areas in which the city is divided, will compete in an enthusiast horse race in Piazza del Campo.

Palio gives its name to this burnout fabrics line made of 66% CO 34% PL. Delicate nuances like white, dove grey, grey and silver are available in width 315/320 cm with lead.







PALLADIO

Palladio, an high quality organza silk in 70% SE 30% PL. **Palladio** nuances recall the colours of the 24 Venetian sixteenth-century villas designed by Andrea Palladio and located in the provinces of Padova, Rovigo, Treviso, Venezia, Verona and Vicenza. **Palladio** is available in 7 natural nuances in width 305/310 cm.

PALMARIA

The small island **Palmaria** is located in the heart of the Cinque Terre Natural Park in front of Porto Venere, in the Gulf of Poets, covered by the Mediterranean forest and perfumed by blooming of the wild jennets. In 1997 **Palmaria** was declared a World Heritage Site.

The curtain inspired by **Palmaria** is a modern Jacquard fil coupè in 90% PL 10% LI in 325/330 cm with lead. It is available in 5 colours from pastel tones to bright colours.







POMPEI

There is only one place in the world where it is possible to relive the ancient Rome daily life: It is **Pompei**, the buried city. In this place, in the region of Campania, buried by the eruption of Vesuvius, time seems to stand still allowing the visitors to travel back in time as in a time machine.

The fabric, in 73% PL 27% LI, is named after this amazing archaeological site and it is characterized by an embroidery with a romantic rebrodè design. **Pompei** is available in 2 colours: natural and ecrù in width 395/300 cm.

PORTOVENERE

It is a municipality of La Spezia Province in Liguria region; it was listed as Unesco World Heritage Site in 1997 along with Palmaria, Tino, Tinetto and Cinque Terre islands.

Porto Venere is a curtain with a printed geometrical design on 100% PL in width 295/300 cm with lead. It is available in three colours: blue, purple and forest green.







REGGIA

The curtain recalls the wonderful Royal Palace of Caserta which was built by King Charles of Bourbon in 1752, sovereign of the Kingdom of Naples and of Sicily, to rival the Versailles one. The Royal Palace along with the Royal Belvedere of Saint Leucio and with the Carloline Acqueduct entered in the World Heritage Site in 1997.

Reggia is a fabric characterized by a particular embossed embroidery which creates a matt and shiny effect in 55% PL 45% LI. It is available in width 325/330 cm in two colours: natural and ecrù.

SASSI

"The stones of Matera" is one of those places that should be seen at least once in life and has been listed as World Heritage Site since 1993.

The curtain, of the new collection inspired to it, is a jacquard barrè stripe in 98% PL 2% LI in width 325/330 cm; **Sassi** is available in four colours: natural, dove grey, grey and cocoa.







SIENA

Siena fabric is named after the Tuscan city, the old town of which was named Unesco heritage in the midgo's. The particularity of **Siena** is Piazza del Campo, objectively one of the most beautiful squares in the world, square where the famous Palio takes place.

Siena is suitable for curtains with two small modern jacquard designs in 57% PL 38% VI 5% SE. Both designs are available in 5 colours: natural, beige, pearl, turtledove and grey in width 320/325 cm.

TARQUINIA

The necropolis of Cerveteri and Tarquinia, included in the Unseco Heritage site in 2004, are exceptional witnesses of ancient Etruscan civilization, the only urban civilization of the pre-Roman times in Italy. The frescoes inside the tombs – real reproductions of Etruscan houses – are a faithful reproduction of daily life of this disappeared culture.

Tarquinia is a simple but effective curtain in 65% PL and 35% CO; the hexagonal pattern has been developed with the devorcolour technique. It is available in three colours: blue, forest green and grey in width 315/320 cm with lead.







TRULLO

The Trulli are typical houses of Alberobello in the south of Puglia Region, they are extraordinary examples of building limestone in dry plates, a technique dating back to prehistoric times, still used in this region and listed as a World Heritage Site since 1996.

Trullo fabric is in 98% PL 2% LI, it is suitable for curtains with its barrè fil coupè stripe. It is available in three colours: white, dove grey and cocoa in with 325/330 cm with lead.

VIETRI

It is an Italian municipality in Salerno province, famous for its pottery, outstanding product of the Amalfi Coast and declared World Heritage Site by Unesco in 1997. The devorcolour fabric, with a design which recalls a sketch on canvas with brilliant colours, takes its inspiration from the pottery.

Vietri is composed of 65% PL 35% CO and it is available in three colours: blue, forest green and grey in width 315/320 cm with lead.







MUSE

The Muses have the highest place in the Divine hierarchy just like the Velvet 100% FR blackout with acrylic coating in width 280 cm, included by CTA in the contract collection Zeus.

Muse is available in 16 colours, suitable for curtains, decoration and upholstery and has a 150,000 turns martindale.
